

Responsibilities of Participants:

1. Follow instructions in filling out your entry forms, and have them checked by your leader.
2. Type if possible or print clearly, a commentary on a 4 x 6" card giving a detailed description of the item to be modeled and something about yourself that will be turned in with the entry form. (See sample below.)
3. Check in on time. Be available to model when the judge calls for you.
4. Write a thank you to the sponsor for any awards you may receive.

Sample commentary:

Emily Brown is all set for spring in this lovely yellow print skirt of 100% cotton fabric. The pull-on skirt is topped with 3 rows of elastic and the hem is finished with a full ruffle. Emily has chosen a pink T-shirt and tights to accent the pink flowers of the print.

The natural straw hat trimmed with a wreath of silk flowers makes this outfit is just right for spring or summer wear. By making this skirt during her first year of sewing, Emily has learned how to make a French seam, stitch elastic casings and gather a ruffle.

Her other 4-H interest is raising rabbits as a member of the Potter Valley Club. Emily also enjoys playing the piano and belongs to a softball team.

Clothing Construction Traditional

Objectives:

To provide an opportunity for 4-H members to:

- Present themselves in a garment which they have made
- Presenting themselves at their best in personal grooming, posture, walking, and assembling their outfit
- Learn poise and have fun
- Show their for creativity

Eligibility:

- All 4-H members may participate and will be critiqued.
- Only those 4-H members enrolled in a Clothing and Textiles project may compete for medals. Those not enrolled in the project will receive placing ribbons
- Primary members will receive participation ribbons.
- Garments under consideration for judging must have been made during the current 4-H year.
- The outfit must be suitable for public wear.
- If a garment is made for someone besides the member, it should be modeled by the other person. The member who made the garment or article must accompany the model.
- A member may enter more than one garment or more than one category (Selection, Embellished Wearable Art, Needle Art, The Handbag Challenge, Recycled, and Construction) in the Fashion Revue.

Entry Form:

Each participant must submit one copy of the Clothing Construction entry form along with a written commentary. (Sample included in packet.) **Send your completed entry forms by the deadline to the Ukiah 4-H Office, 890 N. Bush Street, Ukiah, CA 95482.**

Judging/Critique:

- The Danish Judging System will be used to place Beginning, Junior, and Senior Divisions with first, second, and third ranking. From those placing first, the American Judging System will be used to determine the final winners.
- Judging will be based on the construction of the garment, which includes appropriate fabric selection and construction techniques, and over-all appearance: the fit, grooming, poise, and accessories.
- Expectations at each division level will be based on age and experience.

Divisions:

- The division entered is determined by the member's age as of January 1st of the current project year and their year in clothing. The divisions are as follows:
- **Primary:** K-3rd grade members or those under 9 years of age.
- **Beginner:** First year enrolled in the clothing project or the first time competing in Fashion Revue (Clothing Construction). It is acceptable for beginners to make only part of their outfit, i.e. make a skirt and purchase the top.
- **Junior:** 2nd to 4th year enrolled in the clothing project or the 2nd to 4th times competing in Fashion Revue (Clothing Construction). Juniors are encouraged to make the entire outfit.
- **Senior:** 5th year and above enrolled in the clothing project or the 5th and above times competing in Fashion Revue (Clothing Construction). Seniors must make their entire outfit to be considered for county winner and should demonstrate advanced clothing construction techniques and/or a challenging fabric choice.

Awards:

- Primary Division will be critiqued and will receive participation ribbons.
- Beginning, Junior, and Senior Division member will be eligible for county medals. A county winner and alternate may be chosen from the first place finalists in all divisions.
